An abstract is a brief summary of a research article or any in-depth analysis of a particular subject and is often used to help the reader quickly ascertain the paper’s purpose.

**Keywords:** Keywords should contain the general terms and be plural. Acronym should be effectively used (legal abbreviations used in the field that meet the requirements). These keywords will be used for indexation.

### ***Introduction***

Papers should original research contributions. Papers must be submitted electronically via website [icmust.uinsby.ac.id](http://icmust.uinsby.ac.id) or send to e-mail [icmust@uinsby.ac.id](mailto:icmust@uinsby.ac.id).

This section comprises the background, the literature review or the summary of previous relevant studies, the aims of writing the article, and the description of the problem solving and clear objectives of the research. There are three main distinctive characteristics of the ICMUST article, which include the background, the objectives and method of the study (without using such terms explicitly as subtitles in the main body of the article).

### ***Discussion***

The discussion is highlighted in the title and subtitles of this section. In addition, this section should significantly explore the research findings without redundant and long direct quotation.

Paper length is limited to 20 pages (including all figures, tables, bibliography and appendices). Authors should follow the format found in the *ICMUST Template*. Papers should be in pages with a font size of 12 points using Garamond type for text, title, author information, and main section headings. Papers should be formatted for A4 paper. Top, bottom, and side left and Right margins should be 3 cm. Followed by details of the methods, materials, procedures, and equipment used. Findings, discussion, and conclusions should follow in that order. Appendices may be employed where appropriate. The Turabian Publication Manual should be consulted for details as needed.

The body of paper must range between 3000-4000 words, written in Garamod Style. It could be divided into sections. Sections should be bold. Subsections should be italic.

All terms or titles in Arabic should be transliterated with following the Library of Congress guide. Name of person should not be transliterated.

### ***Conclusion***

The conclusion and recommendation of the author are given in this section and are consistent in using the term “Conclusion”. The conclusion of the research should serve the urgent purposes of the

study within this section. This can be followed by suggesting the relevant future studies.

### **References**

The main references are international journals, proceedings, and books. All references should be to the most pertinent and up-to-date sources. References are written in *Turabian style*. Please use a consistent format for references—see examples below:
